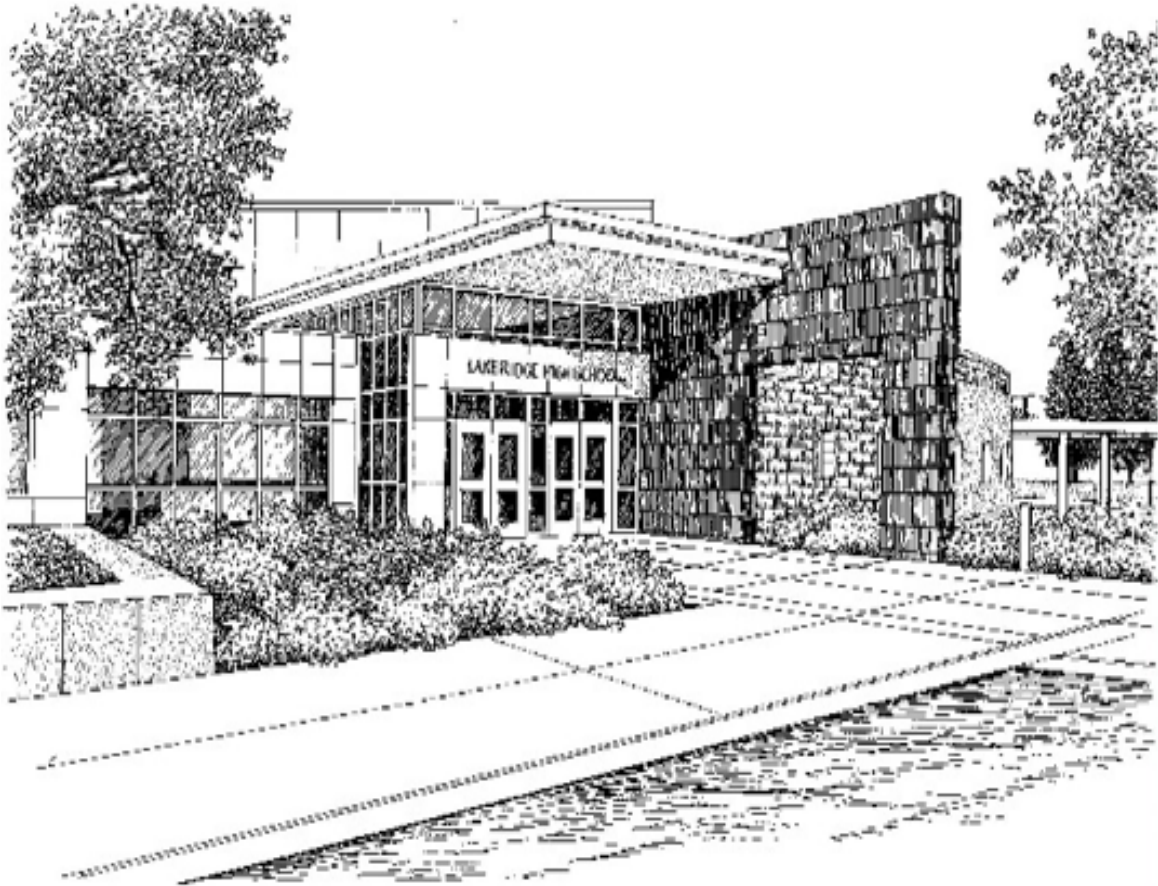

The Community

Lake Oswego is a suburban residential area eight miles from Portland, Oregon with a population of approximately 37,000. It is comprised primarily of business and professional people. The community demonstrates strong support of academic achievement through cooperative alliances with the school district.

The School

Lakeridge High School is a four-year comprehensive public secondary school, which offers a challenging course of study aimed at meeting the needs of a predominately college-bound student body. Lakeridge is accredited through the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. An alternating day schedule with four 90-minute classes daily is offered to all students. Extensive student activity programs include athletics, drama, music, dance, speech, clubs and student government.

Grading System

Students receive letter grades based on their achievement in each class. A letter grade is based on the teacher's professional evaluation of student achievement and mastery of course content. Grade point average is determined using a four-point system for non-weighted class and a five-point system for weighted classes.

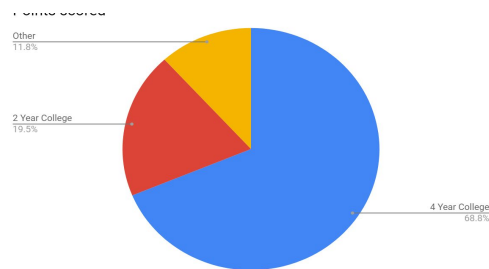

Of the 272 Lakeridge graduates in 2019, 88% reported that they planned to enroll in post-secondary education. Of those, 68.8% plan on attending a 4-year college and 19.5% plan on attending a 2-year college.

About Accelerated Courses of Study

**Biology is a college-prep science class. This lab-based curriculum is based on the molecular and cellular approach to the study of life and, therefore, involves the learning and application of complex processes.

***Human Physiology is an advanced level junior/senior science course. This lab-based curriculum carries the prerequisites of successful completion of Biology and Chemistry. This course requires a college text as well as high-level laboratory work.
