The Oregon Office of Student Access and Completion (OSAC) scholarship application is available online.

OSAC awards more than \$18 million in scholarships annually. Awards range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 or more. You don't need to be a merit scholar or a student with financial need to apply. OSAC administers more than 500 scholarship programs, and you may qualify, but you won't know unless you apply.

Write an original and creative essay that demonstrates an understanding of political courage as described by John F. Kennedy in "Profiles in Courage". Essays must be at least 700 words but no more than 1,000 words. This contest is open to students in 9th-12th grades.
