Oregon State Assessments and 2016-17 Opt Out Information

Every year, students throughout Oregon take state assessments prescribed by the Oregon Department of Education. The purpose of these assessments is to show individual student growth over time and to provide student-specific data that teachers can use to ensure each and every child is on track and achieving learning goals. Results are also used to inform course placement and to provide focused feedback to students and parents.

Oregon state law requires us to inform you that [a form is available](#) from the Oregon Department of Education and I have attached it to this email. This will allow you to opt your child out of state assessments for the 2017-18 school year. Should you wish to opt out your child, please fill out the form and submit it to the main office at your child's school.
